MSC GrabNGo Compost Labels Bill

"A bill requesting for labels or stickers indicating that GrabNGo products in the MSC are compostable."

- Whereas(1):** The MSC Food Court sells GrabNGo food items, which are packaged in commercially compostable containers; and,
- Whereas(2):** Nowhere on the container for any of the food products is it clearly labeled that the item is compostable; and,
- Whereas(3):** The labels for GrabNGo products are printed at Texas A&M and can be adjusted or added to accordingly by either extending the label or adding a sticker; and,

Whereas(4): Properly labeled containers can increase end user compliance and allow for improvements in the compost sorting process; and,

Whereas(5): By including a clearly labeled sticker, consumers of GrabNGo products can contribute to university composting efforts and expand on overarching efforts for increasing sustainability education for students at Texas A&M University.

Therefore

Let it be

Enacted(1): That Chartwells inform all patrons of the MSC Food Court that GrabNGo products are compostable whether through an extension of the current label or an additional sticker indicating thus; and,

Enacted (2): The stickers or extended labels, whichever is chosen, should read, “I’m compostable!” or a phrase along these parameters clearly on the label so consumers are properly informed; and,

Enacted(3): The infographics and how-to diagrams already existing in the Food Court trash, compost, and disposal be updated to also display GrabNGo products as a compostable item; and,
