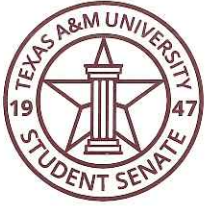

**Whereas(2):** George H.W. Bush exhibited intense patriotism for his state and country, even putting his higher education on hold to enlist in the U.S. Navy on his 18th birthday following Pearl Harbor, becoming the youngest aviator in the Navy; and,

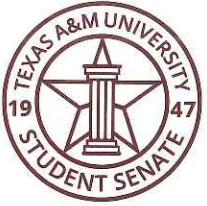
