The Free 30 Minute Parking Garage Bill

"A bill to provide free 30 minute parking spots in all garages."

- Whereas (1): The Texas A&M University Student Senate is the official voice of the student body at Texas A&M University, and has the responsibility to the students to research, legislate, and advocate on their behalf, and,
- Whereas (2): Parking concerns have been a perpetual issue for students at Texas A&M since the introduction of the automobile and organized transportation bureaucracy; and,
- Whereas (3): Many students need to utilize a parking space for a short period of time in areas of campus where only a parking garage offers timely access; and,
- Whereas (4): Students have expressed the concern to utilize the various parking garages across campus for quick trips to the library, MSC, or other central campus locations; and,
- Whereas (5): Free 30 minute spots are offered in various locations across campus for students' use, and should be extended to include parking garages as to accommodate students' busy lifestyle.

Let it be

Enacted (1):

That the 30 minute time period shall begin upon receiving a ticket allowing

entrance into the garage, and conclude upon taking said ticket to a payment kiosk;

and,

Enacted (2):

That, upon taking their ticket to a payment kiosk in a garage, if the patron's time has

accrued less than or equal to 30 minutes, their balance shall read "ticket paid"; and,

Let it be

Further

Enacted (3):

That all Texas A&M University parking garages, both present and future, shall

offer free parking to patrons who accrue less than or equal to 30 minutes during

their stay in the garage; and,

Let it be

Further

Enacted (4):

That patrons who delay in leaving the garage shall pay the set amount, if in the

event they do not exit within the existing 15 minute, or otherwise designated.
