Excused Absence Expansion Bill Special Designation: Senate By-Law Bill

"A bill to excuse absences for Senators attending job interviews and recruitment dinners"

Whereas(1): Members of the Texas A&M Senate will eventually leave this University in pursuit

of careers and financial stability,

Whereas(2): Prospective candidates often have little control over the schedule of their job

interviews, and must work to accommodate their future employers, and

Whereas(3): It is unfair to punish those who miss Senate meetings as a result of factors beyond

their control, such as job interviews,

Therefore Let it be

Enacted(1):

That Section IV, subsection (b) of the Senate By-laws be changed to read:

- (a) An excused absence shall be defined as:
 - (1) An excused university absence as defined in the University Regulations
 - (2) An absence due to a departmentally scheduled exam
 - (3) An absence that the Officers of the Senate deem of merit. All such excused absences must be approved by a majority vote of the Internal Affairs Committee.
 - (4) An absence received as a result of attendance at a professional interview or dinner, provided that the senator provides notification of attendance to the Speaker Pro-Tempore and has not previously used this excuse more than twice during the current Session.

Let it be Further

Enacted(2):

That should the University Regulations be changed to include absences caused by interviews, clause (4) will be deleted from the Senate by-laws.
