The Degree Plan Initiative Bill

"A bill designed to allow students to advise incoming freshmen on how to fill out a degree plan with a margin of error to prepare for future classes."

Whereas(1): Students at Texas A&M University are made aware of their degree plans upon

attending their New Student Conferences by their individual department advisor;

and,

Whereas(2): Not all students follow the sample degree plans offered to students by their

department advisors; and,

Whereas(3): Many students change majors and minors before the completion of their first

semester; and,

Whereas(4): HB 3025 will require students at the beginning of Fall 2012 to file a degree plan

by the time 45 undergraduate hours are taken; and,

Whereas(5): Currently, there is no contingency to file more than one degree plan to account for

a possible change in major for each student; and,

Whereas(6): Many high demand classes throughout the university have been filled up to and

over capacity due to increasing student population and last minute changes by

students who need various classes in order to graduate.

That Student Government Association supports a new student initiative, the

Student Degree Advising Committee, be started in conjunction with the

University Advisory Committee to help freshmen students to file a degree plan

with a margin for change within their first year; and,

member of the Student Degree Advising Committee must meet to be a part of this initiative such as a 3.0 GPA, Junior or above classification, experience as a student leader at Texas A&M University in a recognized student organization, along with prior knowledge of academic affairs at Texas A&M University; and,

That the Colleges within the university use the data filed with each degree plan to

allot appropriate numbers of courses and class sections for future

accommodations to alleviate overcrowding in cramped classes; and,

Enacted(4):

That students who wish to aid incoming freshmen to outline their degree need to

attend the peer mentoring program offered by the Student Learning Center in the

spring before the first New Student Conferences of 2012; and,

Enacted(5):

That the Student Degree Advising Committee be allowed to meet in the YMCA

building during the year to advise students; and,

Enacted(6): The Student Government Association supports the creation in the Howdy portal of

a function in the Degree Plan tab that will allow students to file multiple degree plans if they are undecided on their choice of major in order to alert the Office of

the Registrar; and,
