PASS Certificate Program Recommendation for Students on Academic Probation Bill

"A bill to request that scholastically deficient students who are placed on academic probation be advised to complete the PASS Certificate Program with Texas A&M University Student Counseling Services (SCS) during the course of their academic probation."

Whereas(1): Programs for Academic Success Skills (PASS), administered by Student Counseling Services (SCS) at Texas A&M University, provide students with an opportunity to develop knowledge, skills, and attitudes that will enhance study and exam-taking ability, while decreasing anxiety related to academic performance; and

Whereas(2): Programs for Academic Success Skills (PASS) have a proven record of success; students who completed the PASS Certificate Program during Spring 2009 had an average GPR of 1.98 the semester before participation in the program, while the average GPR at the end of the semester they participated in the program was 2.46. The average GPR for the semester following participation in the program was 2.33.
