The Aggies Against Human Trafficking Resolution

"A resolution acknowledging HB 4009 of the 81st Texas Legislature."

Whereas(1): According to *The Texas Human Trafficking Prevention Task Force Report 2011*, "Texas is home to not only major human trafficking corridors, but many individual

"Texas is home to not only major human trafficking corridors, but many individual trafficking victims are brought to the state and forced to work against their will"; and,

Whereas(2): The "scope of this abhorrent crime is difficult due to the lack of a comprehensive

statewide human trafficking database"; and,

Whereas(3): That "sex trafficking in the five most populous counties in Texas could generate over

\$60 million every year"; and,

Whereas(4): In Texas, for every 29 suspects convicted of human trafficking, only four are

sentenced to prison time in the state; and,

Whereas(5): The two Texas task forces, created by HB 4009, found and rescued 109 children

in 2010, and 100 children in 2009.
