The Meal Plan Rollover Bill

"A bill to rollover University Dining meal plans in full credit between semesters."

Whereas(1): The Texas A&M University Student Government Association serves as the voice

of the student body; and,

Whereas(2): Currently, University Dining transfers only a maximum of \$100 Dining Dollars

within the academic year, consisting of a transfer from the fall to spring semester followed by a transfer period between the spring semester and summer, and only

with a purchase of another meal plan; and,

Whereas(3): Currently, one meal in the meal plan converts to \$3 Dining Dollars between

transfer periods, where combined with the existing Dining Dollars equals to the

rollover amount; and,

Whereas(4): Based on calculations by University Dining, with plans priced at \$1,200 per

semester, the cost of the plan – for food and beverages – averages out to \$11 per

day (Junior and Senior plans average out to \$7.15 per day); and,

Whereas(5): In 2009, approximately 85% of on campus residents voluntarily purchased a plan

averaging \$1,190; and,

Whereas(6): Beginning with the Freshman Class in the Fall of 2012, The students of Texas

A&M living on campus will soon be required, by recent University regulation and against the opinion of the Student Body, to purchase meal plans from University

Dining.

Therefore

Let it be

Enacted(1):

The students of Texas A&M request that no maximum or minimum limit regulate

the amount of Dining Dollars in a meal plan that are transferred within the

academic year; and,

Let it be

Further

Enacted(2):

That the purchase of another meal plan is not required to have Dining Dollars

transferred within the academic year; and,

Let it be

Further

Enacted(3):

That, in all meal plans, meals convert to \$7 Dining Dollars each; and,

Let it be

Further

Enacted(4):

That a copy of this bill be sent to University President R. Bowen Loftin, the Vice

President of Student Affairs, and University Dining Executive Director David

Riddle, within (5) five class days.
