#### Mosher Lane Safety Bill

"A bill to ensure the safety of students in the motorcycle parking lot area in Southside campus by installing a speed bump, in the extension of Mosher Lane, for all motor vehicles."

Whereas(1): The Student Government Association is the voice of the Student Body of Texas A&M University; and,

Whereas(2): Motorcyclists and other motor vehicles exiting and entering the extension of

Mosher Lane, which leads to the Corps housing office past Mosher Circle, pose a

danger to pedestrians, students on bicycles and the general public; and,

Whereas(3): The large waste container structure in the vicinity limits the visibility of vehicles

exiting and entering the respective area; and,

Whereas(4): Currently, the speed limit enforced on Mosher Lane, including its extension, is 30

miles per hour, according to state law and as a result of no speed limit signage

installed on Mosher Lane.
