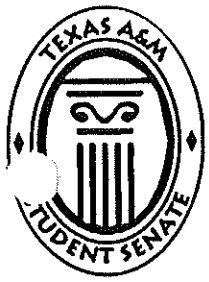

Veterans Priority Registration Bill

"A bill requesting that veterans be allowed to have priority registration for classes."

- Whereas(1):** The veteran population of Texas A&M University is currently under 1000 students; and,
- Whereas(2):** Currently, most veterans with GI Bills have to complete their education within a four years before their funding in the GI Bill runs out; and,
- Whereas(3):** Some veterans on campus are reactivated and spend many months if not years away from Texas A&M, requiring them to extend their education longer than four years; and,
- Whereas(4):** The current GI Bill policy mandates that veterans have to follow their degree plans or they will not get funding; and,
- Whereas(5):** Many majors have changed their academic benchmarks while activated veteran are on duty overseas requiring some veterans to take courses that meet some academic requirements for their preferred major outside of their degree plan in order to remain in their respective majors thereby threatening their GI Bill funding.
